Vital community space must not be sold: the battle to save Corpus Christi Hall

Corpus Christi parish hall on the Home Farm Road has been a hive of daily community activity for almost six decades. However the hall is now closed and its future is highly uncertain. There are real concerns locally that this vital local community space may be sold off.

Unfortunately, there has been a failure by church authorities to engage with local residents on their plans for the hall and they intend to resolve the alleged fire safety issues in the hall.

In December, we brought together a public meeting of residents and local groups and the message was very clear: we must preserve this vital community space and oppose any potential sell-off. In February, residents started a major campaign for the re-zoning of the hall to maintain its community use. This is only the start of the campaign to bring the hall back to use!

No more suffering in silence: putting reproductive health leave on the agenda

For far too long, women have had to remain silent in their workplaces about the grief of early miscarriage, or have had to use their annual leave to attend appointments for IVF treatments.

My colleague Ivana Bacik and I have brought forward legislation that would provide up to 20 days' paid leave for women who suffer an early miscarriage, and 10 days for workers going through fertility treatment.

I'm delighted to say that our bill is now being supported by Government. We will keep fighting until women undergoing reproductive health challenges finally have the law on their side.

Fire fighters and ambulance drivers need our support

Fire fighters and ambulance drivers are saving lives throughout the city in increasingly challenging conditions.

There has been an ongoing failure to recruit, plan for retirements and acquire new equipment for our fire and ambulance services. Services are now stretched to breaking point creating an unacceptable risk to firefighters and the city as a whole.

In recent weeks, some progress has been made between SIPTU & Forsa and management - immediate rise in the number of recruits and promise to look at new stations and modernising equipment.

Tackling the disgraceful legacy of construction defects

Right now there are thousands of people across our community who can only dream of buying a home.

And yet for many who do own an apartment, their dream has become a nightmare with the discovery of life-threatening fire and structural defects.

I know of six blocks and over 900 apartments across our communities suffering from the deadly effects of boomtime construction shoddiness.

I have been meeting with those affected over recent months. Some are facing bills of up to \in 50,000 to make their apartments safe and liveable, with no support from the Government. While landlords can currently write off the cost of these works, ordinary homeowners cannot. This must change.

We need the State to step in and take accountability for its failure to properly regulate and hold bad builders to account. This is not just an issue for apartment owners but for anyone who hopes to be safe and secure in a home of their own.

Good News for Local Schools

Clonturk Community College: As a former Board of Management member, I was delighted that agreement has been secured to build a new 1,000 pupil school building on its existing site in Whitehall. This is great news for this thriving school community. It's the first second-level school established jointly by the City of Dublin ETB and Educate Together.

Gaelscoil Coláiste Mhuire: It seems that after almost 18 long years of waiting, the sod will hopefully be turned on the new school building site on Dominick Street this Autumn. Huge credit to the many families who've been campaigning so hard to get to this stage. I know for many, it will be a case of seeing will be believing. We'll keep up the pressure to ensure that this deadline is met!

Gaelscoil Aine: This new primary school is temporarily located on the grounds of Coláiste Chaoimhín on St. Mobhi Road. The Department of Education has committed to put arrangements in place for the continued location of the school there in September 2022. I understand that it will re-locate to a permanent site in Drumcondra over the next number of years.

Households need more help to cut emissions and energy bills



So many people want to cut their carbon emissions and lower their energy bills – but the barriers to access government retrofitting schemes are still too high, especially for renters.

The potential savings at stake from retrofitting are huge. A three-bed house with an "F" energy rating can cost €2,400 more to heat per year than a freshly retrofitted home. It can also release more than four times as much carbon into the atmosphere.

Current Government plans rely on too many homeowners borrowing money for improvements, while leaving renters powerless. We need to go much further in increasing grant funding – for our own sake and for the planet.

RENTS AND EVICTIONS

Rent Increases: Since December 2021, your rent can only rise by 2% on an annual basis.

However, it's important to know that the landlord can legally apply the 2% increase for every year of your tenancy since your rent was last changed.

You can use the Residential Tenancies Board's free calculator to help find out whether and by how much your landlord can legally raise your rent: www.rtb.ie/calculator/rpz
